

If my child has SEND, what activities are available to him or her?

All educational visits (including residential visits) are open to all pupils. Adult support and resources are made available to ensure that all pupils can access these activities. Teachers work closely with parents/carers before visits to discuss specific needs of each pupil with SEND.

All extra-curricular activities (including breakfast club and after school clubs) are available to all children and will be suitably differentiated and supported to ensure access for all.

No pupil is removed from activities at Hasland Junior School unless at the request of parents/carers or unless advice is provided by parents from a medical source which advises otherwise.

The member of staff responsible for the planned club, trip or residential will complete a risk assessment for the organised activity and as part of this plan, will identify children with SEND that may need to be offered additional support or have reasonable adjustments made, to ensure they can access the opportunity given. During this planning, the member of staff responsible will liaise with parents, child's teacher and SENCO if specialist provision is to be made.

Children with SEND are actively encouraged to contribute to all parts of school life. There are many examples within our school where children with SEND have represented the School in such things as PE and music events and have taken on roles of responsibility such as being part of the School Council or showing visitors around school.
