Pupil Premium allocation

Barriers to future attainment for Pupil Premium children:

In school barriers:

- 1. Pupil Premium pupils are not attaining significantly above the national standard at the higher level in Reading, Writing and Maths combined at Y6.
- 2. Pupil Premium pupils are not making progress significantly above the national standard at the higher level in Reading, Writing and Maths combined at Y6.
- 3. To continue to narrow the gap in attainment between pupil premium and non pupil premium pupils in all areas and in all year groups.
- 4. For the current Year 6 cohort, the gap between Pupil Premium pupils and non Pupil premium pupils (when compared to the national difference in 2015) is greater in writing and GAPS at the expected standard and in reading, writing and Maths at above the expected standard. Progress also needs to be accelerated in writing, GAPS and reading.

External barriers:

5. Attendance for Pupil Premium children was 95% for the year 2015/16. The attendance for all pupils was 97.36%.

Desired outcomes:

- 1. To increase the percentage of Pupil Premium pupils attainment at the higher level in Reading, Writing and Maths combined at Y6.
- 2. To accelerate the progress of Pupil Premium pupils at the higher level in Reading, Writing and Maths combined at Y6.
- 3. The gap in attainment between pupil premium and non pupil premium pupils to be narrowed in all areas and in all year groups.
- 4. For the current Year 6 cohort, the gap between Pupil Premium pupils and non Pupil premium pupils to be narrowed in writing and GAPS at the expected standard and in reading, writing and Maths at above the expected standard. For Pupil Premium children to make accelerated in writing, GAPS and reading.
- 5. To narrow the gap in attendance between Pupil Premium pupils and non Pupil Premium pupils

PP budget for year 2016/17: Approximately £115,560

This is how we have decided to divide the allocation in order to achieve the desired outcomes:

- Additional teaching to work with all pupil premium children, including on costs £25,000
- Additional teacher to work with Year 6 pupil premium children for the Autumn Term, including on costs £15,100
- Progress meetings for pupil premium children £660
- Sports Clubs £1,800
- Homework Clubs £5,320
- Additional teaching assistant support approx. £68,000
- Booster sessions in Y5 approx. £2,760
- Booster sessions in Y6 approx. £2,760
- Attendance awards, six times per year £1,000
- Achievement rewards £700
- Subsidising trips £4,000

- Support for young carers £300
- Contingency to be used for innovative projects identified when visiting schools of excellence £1,000

The total allocated is greater than the Pupil Premium allocation and will be funded by the School Budget.

What is going to be implemented 2016-17 in order to achieve the desired outcomes:

- There will be a pupil premium teacher working in every year group, establishing working relationships with all children, helping to ensure they are on track to meet their end-of-year targets.
- There will be an additional teacher in Year 6 to work with pupil premium children for the Autumn Term. This is to accelerate progress and narrow the attainment gap therefore addressing the in school barrier for this cohort.
- Pupil premium children will be supported in the majority of English and Maths lessons.
- There will be a Teaching Assistant in every class for English and Maths during morning sessions and five Teaching Assistants working across school delivering interventions in the afternoons to help pupil premium children make better than expected progress.
- Time will be set aside for staff to identify areas of difficulty, analyse data and plan support for pupil premium children.
- Pupil premium children will be identified for support in booster sessions.
- There is a big push throughout school to improve attendance and punctuality, with particular reference to pupil premium children.
- Every Pupil Premium child will be offered free attendance at an after school Sports Club for a term to give these children the opportunity to pursue a sports interest.
- Pupil Premium children are subsidised on certain trips in order to give them life experiences.
